# Welcome to OVFF VIII!





# LARRY WARNER

### Bare Chested Sex Symbol or Velvety Voiced Singer? You be the judge!

I first met Larry when he sent me the only honest-to-goodness fan letter I have ever received. It was such a charming, kind, interesting letter that I immediately called to thank him. After a meeting of the mutual admiration society, we talked for a long time and began to correspond. (I don't write to just anyone let me tell you! Me? Write a letter? Ha!) I remember thinking: "Wow. What a great guy! Interesting, reads, has a great voice, writes wonderful songs, good looking, kind, great sense of humor, talented, likes children, intelligent...too bad he lives in Arizona."

Larry works at the "Arizona Museum for Youth" where he is a Graphic Artist and Museum Exhibits Designer. He is quite possibly the only person I know that I can go sight seeing with and say "Look at the lines of that trashcan! What a great design!" and feel confident that he does not think I am completely bonkers. As I mentioned he is a professional graphic artist and although most filkers know him for his beautiful voice, his art work is not to be ignored!

Neither is his chest. Larry has a solo tape out on Thor Records called "Through My Eyes". I had the great pleasure of working with him on this project. He also wrote the first serious Star Wars song I liked: "The Best Starpilot In The Galaxy". Larry has been a filk GOH at Toronto Trek, and at Balticon. We are lucky to finally get him to the midwest. Whatever you do - don't ask Larry about the nude recording sessions though. He'll blush.

### Marie Schneider Listener Goest of honor
